



RETIREE BLACK LAKE RETREAT June 30 – July 3, 2024

**TO: ALL UAW REGION 1A RETIREE CHAPTER CHAIRPERSONS,
LOCAL UNION PRESIDENTS AND FINANCIAL SECRETARIES**

Greetings:

As captioned above, reservations have been made at the Walter & May Reuther Family Education Center for the 2024 UAW Region 1A Retiree Black Lake Retreat.

Rates for the retreat are as follows:

- **Single Occupancy - \$402.50**
- **Double Occupancy - \$275.00 (per retiree)**
- **Couple Package - \$550.00 (per couple)**

The package includes room accommodations and all meals, starting with dinner on Sunday, June 30, 2024. (As you know, the Region 1A Retired Workers' Council cannot subsidize retreat/weekends at Black Lake.)

Please indicate those who have a **severe** handicap, keeping in mind there are only a few rooms available near the dining room. We will do our best to place all handicapped on the first floor.

Reservations will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis and the deadline is **June 10, 2024**. **We have been allocated space to accommodate 290 retirees.**

It is important that Local Unions collect the money from their members who will be attending. One check, from the Local, should be made payable to: UAW REGION 1A and forwarded to the Region, ATTENTION: NOVA SCHOLLENBERGER, with the enclosed registration form for each retiree. This should also include the \$10 bus fee, for each retiree riding the bus.

We hope all retirees will ride the buses to Black Lake. **The cost to ride the bus is \$10 per person.** Buses will leave UAW Region 1A **on Sunday, June 30, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.** You may park your car in the Region's parking lot (West side) where you will return at approximately **5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 3, 2024.**

No food will be supplied on the bus trip; however, a stop will be made for lunch on Sunday, June 30, 2024. A comfort stop will be made where refreshments are available on the return trip home on Wednesday, July 3, 2024.
